Please allow at least <u>six months</u> of preparation time. Date arrangements are made after the initial meet with pastor before any other commitments are made.


#### **Ministry of the Sick**

## Season of Glorious Resurrection Peter is Chosen to Guide the Flock May 19, 2019



Peter, a simple fisherman, was called to walk with Jesus. Three years later, Jesus gives Peter a charge. Jesus asks this fisherman to pick up a shepherd's staff.

Peter is the right man for this job. Because he, more than anyone, understands the power of Jesus' forgiveness and the extent of His grace.

Jesus gives Simon a new name. He names him Kepha in Aramaic = Peter in English. When God gives a person a new name, it reflects a new God-ordained mission and status. Jesus gives Simon Peter "the keys" to the kingdom of Heaven = a sharing of royal authority. St. Peter is given the keys by Jesus and is thus designated His steward.

Jesus gives Simon Peter the power to shepherd the flock = administrative authority. Peter is the chosen leader of the church. He was given the charge to take care of everyone.
